GENESIS 7:17-19:17

HEARTPRINT: GOD TAKES CARE OF US

The Heartprint is the main Bible concept or truth from each unit that we want to imprint upon your child's heart. Repeating this Heartprint often may seem redundant, but it will serve as a vital aid in teaching this truth to your preschooler.

Application Verse: God is with us wherever we go (Joshua 1:9c).

Today your child learned how God took care of Noah, his family, and the animals when the entire earth was flooded. Use the following ideas to involve your child in family time and learning opportunities, reinforcing simple biblical themes.

FAMILY TIME



Bath time is a perfect opportunity to review the story of Noah. Bring a floatable boat and a plastic cup into the bathtub. Let your child experiment by pouring water over the boat and talk about how the boat floats in the water. Review the story of Noah with your child and how God took care of Noah, his family, and all of the animals in the ark. **God Takes Care of Us** too. Remind your child God promised He would never again flood the entire earth, and He keeps His promises.



Sing this song with your child to the tune of "The Farmer in the Dell."
God takes care of us.
God takes care of us.
God loves us and keeps us safe.

Pray with your child, and thank God for taking care of Noah, his family, and the animals during the Flood. Ask God to help you remember His promise whenever you see a rainbow. The following is a rhyme your child uses in class to settle down for prayer time:

Open and shut them, open and shut them (open and close fingers),
Give your hands a clap (clap hands).

Open and shut them, open and shut them (open and close fingers),


Put them in your lap (put your hands together in your lap).

Even at this age, children can participate and learn to be still during a short prayer time.



If there is an object that comforts your child when he or she is afraid, get it. Discuss how Noah may have felt on the ark. Talk about how God took care of Noah, his family, and the animals when the rain came. God kept them safe until the water went away and it was safe to get out of the ark. Talk about the many different ways God takes care of your child. God promised Noah that He would never again destroy the earth with a flood. God keeps His promises. Remind your child of God's promise to Noah when you see a rainbow and remember how God took care of him. **God Takes Care of Us** too.

TEACHER/PARENT INSTRUCTIONS: Encourage the child to trace the letters and the lines of the waves and then color the ark. Noah, his family, and the animals were safe because God took care of them. **God Takes Care of Us too.**
